Whether arriving by car, train or bus, Warrensburg is conveniently located in the heart of the nation just twenty minutes south of Interstate 70, directly off U.S. Highway 50 with Missouri Highway 13 running through its middle. All facilities are within ten minutes travel time of each other, lodging and all amenities. Dubbed as a "Train Town USA" community, today Amtrak and Jefferson Bus Lines stop at the historic train depot providing visitors accessibility to stroll the downtown district full of shopping, art galleries, antique shops, cultural events, and restaurants.

You can plan to visit historical landmarks including the original town square, the original 1838 Johnson County Courthouse, Mary Miller Smiser Heritage Library and Museum, Elm School-one-room school, and the Culp Building. Attend a festival, performing arts event or a university sporting event. Rediscover the great outdoors at the many parks nearby such as Cave Hollow Park offering hiking, fishing, picnicking, playground, and several caves on the property to explore.

Warrensburg boasts a diverse culture attributable to two main influences. The first is Whiteman Air Force Base which operates and maintains the U.S. Air Force's premier weapon systems. The second is the University of Central Missouri, which delivers a world class education by providing a small-college learning environment coupled with large-university opportunities and cultural offerings. Warrensburg's strong heartland work ethic and community pride make it a great place to do business.

With its rich history, convenient location, cultural influences, work ethic and community pride, you will find that Warrensburg has even more to offer than you may have expected. We hope that your visit is a memorable experience and that you share it with others.



Curiosities to explore, games to be played and fun to be had can be found at Retrograde Charitable Toy and Video Game Museum, a fully functional arcade and ever-growing pop culture museum. Among the vintage toys, rare collectibles and oddities is a mission to help people engage with their childhood and each other.

The museum started with friends Brian Chamberlin, Ryan Edmondson and Jed Rhodes who founded the museum and arcade from their own collections, and it quickly grew as new pieces were found or donated. In the years since, the three friends have continued to take an active role in Retrograde as a not-for-profit, with Brian serving as president and

Ryan and Jed serving as co-vice presidents.

The charity also works with local after-school groups to make memories for the next generation through clubs and programs hosted at Retrograde. Brian said community involvement and education initiatives have always been a focus for the organization.

"We're also trying to build leadership in that next generation," Brian said. "Also, teaching the ideal that everything in that building was just an idea, was somebody's dream and if you apply that ... you too can do that."

The museum displays games, toys and oddities, but it also shows the progression of technology as those games and toys changed with time.

"It gives a way for families to connect and for people to connect with those objects and all those old toys and technology," Brian said.

Items in the museum are primarily for display only while all games in the arcade are fully operational. Brian said that amid the action figures and autographed artwork, one of the coolest pieces in the museum is a "bone music" record, bootleg western music pressed into Soviet-era x-rays. The museum's bone record is a chest x-ray with a recording of "Moses come down" by Louis Armstrong.

"When people ask me (about my favorite piece) generally I always say it's the next thing we collect," Brian said.

Brian said the collection is guaranteed to be something visitors can not see anywhere else.

"Something that appears to be in retrograde appears to be moving backward but is always moving forward and that's what we're doing," Brian said. "By taking people backward, we move forward together."



COURTHOUSE CONCERT SERIES

CANDLELIT AND UNAMPLIFIED:
LIVE PERFORMANCES STEEPED
IN HISTORY

The Candlelight Courthouse Concerts highlight unique music in a unique setting. Guests - and maybe a few ghosts - unplug for an evening of live music hosted in the Old Johnson County Courthouse, constructed in the 1800's. Due to its construction, the courthouse is well known for its acoustics which is part of the reason organizer Eddie Osborne initially approached the Johnson County Historical Society about using it as a venue.

"In 2009 the historical society had a Smithsonian exhibit ... celebrating America's rich music and I thought 'why don't we put on a concert at the courthouse?'" Eddie said.

The Old Johnson County Courthouse, maintained by the JCHS, is on the National Register of Historic Places. JCHS President Bruce Uhler said the concert series brings attention to the Old Town Square and curiosity about the history of Johnson County.

"(Eddie) has such a great connection to all the local bands in Kansas City and here in central Missouri ... it seems they love the acoustics in the building," Bruce said.

Each performance is an evening of entertainment and an opportunity to step back into history, highlighting the charm of historic buildings. The courthouse has been restored to how it would have been after construction was finished in 1842, including a

period-correct American flag. "The acoustics of the building allow me to present it unamplified because the walls are two feet thick," Eddie said. Since 2009, the series has hosted more than 200 concerts.

The artists and groups vary in size and genre, but are primarily acoustic or unamplified, adding to the already charming setting. Though now retired, Eddie's career as the long-time host and producer of the radio program "Eclectic Cafe" has helped him recruit local talent as well as artists from across the country to perform as part of the series.

"When I had the radio show it was a matter of introducing people to music that they may not hear over commercial radio," Eddie said. "It was music for the mind, heart, feet, and soul. The concert series is about bringing that same concept to people in the community,"

Eddie said he believes everyone deserves to be entertained which is why the concerts are open to the public, but a free-will donation is accepted to cover the cost of the performers and any additional funds are given to the JCHS.

JAVA JUNCTION



Java Junction is the coffee spot at a crossroad. Located at the corner of Holden and West Pine streets, it offers patrons the opportunity to watch the bustle of downtown Warrensburg through large windows as they enjoy a latte, sip a cup of coffee after a morning of shopping or grab an americano to-go before boarding the train. The cafe offers a select menu, made from coffee beans roasted in-house. Though some pastries are available, the focus is the coffee.

"I tell people our coffee's good because I have to drink it," owner Art Ozias said. "I need some really top-notch coffee. You know that if I'm drinking it you'll probably like it because I have to have good quality stuff."

Art says his favorite menu item is the drip coffee made using a Chemex, and his favorite espresso drink is a cappuccino. Bags of the coffee beans used to make that top-notch coffee also are for sale.

The cafe is iconic in its ambiance and aesthetic, with historical details emphasized throughout, from the tin ceiling tiles down to the hardwood floors. There is jazz floating through the air and local nature photography on the walls.

The Old Drum Open Mic Nights, designed to allow local musicians, poets and writers to perform, are hosted 6-8 p.m. at Java Junction on the first Thursday of every month. Java Junction is often the first stop for passengers stepping off the Amtrak or students looking to get off campus for a few minutes.

The cafe has even served as a wedding venue during service hours. Art said he was surprised when a minister, bride and groom showed up, sat down and started exchanging vows. Art congratulated the couple and the groom explained he was from New York and the bride was from Los Angeles and the couple had decided Java Junction was the perfect place to meet in the middle.

YUMMY'S DONUT PALACE

Doughnuts, boba and a great start to your day, Yummy's Donut Palace has everything a morning sweet tooth could crave. A selection of doughnuts are made fresh in-house every morning, including classic cake and yeast doughnuts, custard-filled long johns, apple fritters and donut holes.

Yummy's takes a turn from the traditional accompanying hot coffee with an array of boba teas, smoothies and iced coffee. Boba tea (also known as bubble tea) is famous for the iconic chewy tapioca "bubbles" that give the drink its signature look making delightful for kids and adults to try.

If a sweet treat is not your thing, Yummy's also offers biscuits and gravy, bagels, breakfast sandwiches and sausage rolls.

Anna and her husband, co-owner Sarat Keo, moved to Warrensburg from California during the pandemic. After two years of ownership, Anna said she still loves to eat doughnuts.

"People said I might not eat doughnuts or I might get tired of it, but (that's) wrong," Anna said. "I eat glazed (doughnuts) with my coffee every morning ... I never get tired of donuts."

Anna said their most popular doughnut is her personal favorite: the classic glazed.

Yummy's is located within walking distance from the University of Central Missouri and is frequented by students and campus visitors.

Because the doughnuts are made fresh every day, Yummy's often donates leftover doughnuts, if there are any, to local law enforcement or schools.

Like your breakfast on the go? The drive-thru is speedy. Need a couple dozen doughnuts for the breakroom? Large boxes are available. Trying boba for the first-time? Anna recommends the classic Thai milk tea with black boba.



121 FARMHOUSE KITCHEN MARKET

Off the beaten path and down a gravel road is the ever-growing 121 Farmhouse Kitchen Market. Owner Ashland Bell started 121 Farmhouse Kitchen as an in-home bakery as a way to make ends meet and has seen it grow into 121 Farmhouse Kitchen Market.

Ashland started the bakery as a side business in 2013. I started baking and going to farmers markets," Ashland said.

Ashland went back to a full-time job later in 2013 but continued to sell baked goods on the side for several years.

At the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic Ashland added a pickup box outside her home that customers used to pick up orders

which then became the catalyst to move the business into a 10'x 12' shed. "When we opened our self-service market, the plan was for the store to sustain itself for two years while I was still employed," Ashland said. "That lasted two weeks before I realized that I could not continue to work full-time and continue to keep the market full, to be open seven days a week. Within two weeks I left my full-time job and here I am."

"It's your one-stop-shop, not just for basic groceries," Ashland said. "It's also for gifts, all of your bakery needs and anything local."

Ashland works with about 25 consignors, of which about 17 are local small businesses entrepreneurs. 121 Farmhouse Kitchen Market includes a fully inspected kitchen for the bakery

and a separate retail space featuring Ashland's baked goods as well as MO GROWN and produced meats, cheeses, candies, milk, ice cream, soap, plants, produce, candles and many other unique wares and hand-crafted items.

121 Farmhouse Kitchen Market continues to be self-service, allowing the market to remain open 365 days a year. Ashland said her favorite thing about the market is getting to meet people.

"I love meeting new people," Ashland said. "I love hearing where they're from, how they love the concept and ability to shop local producers, how they wish they had something like this at their hometown."

Ashland said she enjoys being able to provide the community with local goods as well as work with consignors.

"(I love) to provide people who are doing the same thing I was doing, which is running a side gig while working a full-time job, a place to sell their wares without having to be gone every weekend at a craft show or on the road," Ashland said. "Been there, done that. ... I like to be able to provide them a space to sell their items every day."

With the growth of the business, Ashland continues to manage the day-to-day operations of the business and continues to make the desserts and baked goods that started it all.

RISE RACKS

Beyond the thrill of finding a good deal, RISE Racks helps employees find connection within the community. For customers, the store offers casual clothing, office attire, seasonal decor and kitchen essentials as well as handmade items. For RISE clients, the store is an opportunity to build confidence and skills.

"What we stand for is Respecting Individuals, Skills and Efforts," RISE Director Misty Miller said.

The store has seen a steady flow of donations and customers since opening its doors in August of 2022. "You are going to expect very, very affordable

prices ... essentially, you're going to get a good bargain," Misty said.

The store is operated as part of the RISE Community Services mission to provide opportunities, support and advocacy for individuals with developmental disabilities and resources for their families. The organization also oversees the RISE vocational center and the RISE Cafe as well as community employment opportunities.

A major component of the RISE mission is community involvement. Misty said RISE works to help their clients find meaningful employment, inclusive opportunities and

community connection.

"My favorite part about working for RISE is getting out in the community and socializing," Holly Davidson, a RISE client, said. Misty said RISE Racks helps to invest in quality of life opportunities for RISE clients, creating opportunities to help people shine and grow their confidence professionally and personally.

"(RISE Racks) helps people with disabilities go out into society and get jobs and be able to be social," Holly said.

Misty said the store is a way to involve the community in RISE's mission as people donate items or look through the racks for that perfect find. The store is constantly bringing in new products, with new items stocked daily.

"What we wanted to create with RISE Racks is that community inclusion component and connecting us to the community in a different aspect," Misty said. "With this opportunity, the community can invest in the programs and the skills development for the individuals to learn and grow and to experience something that they may not have, or may not know that is available to them."
